A Rush hat in a Day

Spend a day creating a traditional rush hat. These hats can be made in a variety of styles including a sunhat, bowler style or trilby. The hats are made around a mould and the techniques used can be easily mastered. The workshop will include illustrations about the gathering and processing of the rushes and a bit about the history of rush use in this country. No previous experience needed

Painting with the Earth

This workshop will explore locally found earth pigments, their history, geology, chemistry and uses as paint. We will spend the morning collecting a variety of colours from their geological source at Greencilff, where a seam of the locally unique 'Bideford Black' is exposed. We will then return to Hallsennery to experiment with the process of paint making and to create pictures of our own.

Christmas Willow Work



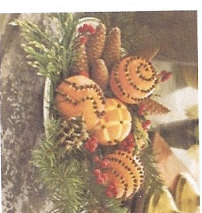

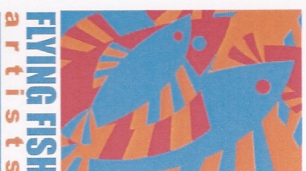
