## TIPS FOR MAKING SCARECROWS

Here are some basic ideas to start you off. However, there are no "rules" for making a prize-winning Scarecrow. You may have a much better plan.

## **Materials:**

- \* A stake of some sort if you're making a standing scarecrow
- \* 2 pairs of tights are useful one for the head and arms and one for the hips and legs.
- \* A bin bag or plastic sack for the body.
- \* Stuffing could be screwed up plastic bags, plastic milk bottles. (Straw and paper will need to be in plastic bags to be weatherproof.)
- \* Old clothes and overalls are useful.
- \* Stuffed surgical gloves or gardening gloves can be used for the hands.
- \* Old shoes or boots for feet.
- \* Unravelled synthetic rope or wool for hair.
- \* Metal coat hangers for the shoulders.
- \* A chair for a seated Scarecrow.
