



#### Life on the Yeo - Otters and a Mink

Over the fourteen years that I've lived in the valley I've seen of otters some 6 times, but much more frequently find their evidence – droppings otherwise known as scat. Last year for a number of weeks there was an accumulation close to a large ash tree undercut by the river's flow by our garden - I guess a temporary holt though I never caught sight of him.



But first the American Mink. It must be stated mink are an invasive species recklessly released from mink farms and a registered pest and by law if caught must be "dispatched". Now I've always had a sneaking admiration for mink having watched them hunt in Iceland and Scotland. However when

it comes to having one on *my* river, eating *my* birds and *my* fish!!! (well to be more accurate Charlie Withecombe's as he gave permission to fish from his banks – many thanks Charlie). One year I repeatedly saw a mink, once with an eel (please note an increasingly threatened species) as long as itself. The little critter was well aware of my presence but equally aware of that he was much more in his element than I and showing utter contempt for me! Mink really are cocky characters. A few days later I was by the river and there he was again, in and out of the water and the rocks (well, dumped concrete debris from repairs to the Bideford Long Bridge to be precise). I watched him and he watched me then continued his business, occasionally casting a glance to check where I was – cheeky devil!

The last time I saw the mink I was fishing and he was moving upstream of me – I let him move upstream hoping that he hadn't wiped out the trout. To my surprise when not only did he return downstream but, I kid you not, ran right over my foot! Well I had been standing heron-like, rod in hand. I attempted to give chase with my landing net, but as I said, he was in his element and I was not. Fortunate really, as otherwise he'd have made a right old mess of my prized net and probably a worse mess of my equally prized right hand! For not only are mink confoundedly cocky they're also pretty ferocious! Any way that was the last of saw of the mink – I'm guessing that he tried tangling with the much larger otter – and otters don't much care for competition on their patch. Saved from the moral dilemma of admiration and justified wildlife law by probably my favourite wild creature.

It's a funny thing that the sight of a mink makes most fishermen see red, but the sight of an otter sends us weak at the knees (well, these days anyway), despite being much larger with an appetite to match. So onto some treasured "ottery" moments.

The first I recall was when I was sitting by the river with Cathy and her old dog Tubby. I remember seeing a broad brown head and sinuous tail swimming upstream towards us and me stage whispering "OTTER". I took my eyes away for a moment to grab Tubby's collar on the off chance that he had the unexpected wit to know what an otter was and fancied taking on the role of the Devonian otter hound. And that was it – the big male otter did a Houdini – not even a ripple to show where he'd been. Later that year I saw him (well likely the same one given how territorial they are) swimming down river – this time I had a camera handy and managed a couple of not very good photos. Of course once he'd sensed me and carried on downstream completely underwater preventing any better pictures.

A few years later I was standing in the garden admiring the view up the valley when I noticed large swirls in the river beneath me – wow I thought, that's a large fish! Then I saw them – a mother and kit fishing in the back water. Round about that time I was wading up upstream near the house, caught a couple of small trout and was feeling pretty chipper. Then a swirl and an otter emerged onto the concrete blocks dumped on the bank and ran upstream. To my amazement the trout continued to rise, seemingly undisturbed by their nemesis.



One of most interesting sightings that Mari and I saw was a couple of years ago. We were enjoying the view of a duck and her many ducklings when a large dog otter appeared – the mother duck went ballistic – making a right

old fuss, flapping and playing wounded to distract the otter from her easily taken brood. To our surprise the otter completely ignored the vulnerable youngsters and continued to determinedly plough upstream through the riffles – we thought that he must have had something else on his mind - and it wasn't food!

My most exciting encounter was last year. I was wading upstream where there is a large pool discharging into a deeper narrow stretch of faster water. A large bow wave appeared on the pool – my first thought was "I'd never be able to land that fish" when I noticed a trail of bubbles – OTTER!! It turned downstream towards me – when it was just a couple of feet from me (no exaggeration!) it stuck its head out of the water, saw me (with the usual look of surprise that otters always have) panicked and disappeared in a cloud of sediment and that was it. A youngster but old enough to have been abandoned by its mother. The highlight of the day, well month!


