



GOODLIVING - INTO THE FUTURE

After 24 years of sacrificial service to the Christian Community of North Devon, Christina needs to retire. Without some action there will be no continuing outlet or service centre in the area. In the light of reports last month of a big increase in spirituality



enquiries and 87% increase in Bible purchases (SPCK) we need to keep this Christian witness operating.

We are setting up a charity to operate Goodliving as soon as possible. The new charity will need to buy out the current assets owned by Christina so that she can walk away. We also need to recruit volunteers to operate the charity on a daily basis.

Currently, Goodliving opens a shop 5 days per week with few extended services. There is scope for development into other Christian bookshop activities given available staff and funding

We need:

- 1. Volunteers. Initially to enable the shop to open each day.
- 2. Immediate and longer term funding to enable us to acquire the assets currently held in the shop (i.e., stock, computer systems, fittings, etc.).

There are also some long-term commitments bringing the total projected investment over the next 2 years to £80,000. **We have already received some substantial donations** and we are looking for further grants and interest free loans to put the bookshop on a secure footing for the future. Shop trading is currently breaking even. We are looking to increase turnover to cover inflationary costs.





Voluntary Road Warden Scheme

Road Wardens are voluntary positions within local town and parish councils providing support to carry out minor

jobs that Devon County Council are no longer able to resource and do not have a legal responsibility to carry out. This work includes minor pothole repairs, clearing weeds, cleaning road signs, cleaning drainage, grass cutting, repairing finger posts and other minor works.

Full training is provided and, in the unlikely event of a claim, Devon County Council will also cover the public liability aspect of insurance for voluntary work on the public highway or footway, providing it is undertaken in a safe manner according to county council advice. This, for example, would cover any claims by a third party as a result of works, which the county council would defend if works were carried out in accordance with county council advice.

Devon County Council will not provide any other form of insurance cover for this activity which must be undertaken at the volunteers own risk. So, for example, any damage to one's own person, property or vehicle would not be covered.
